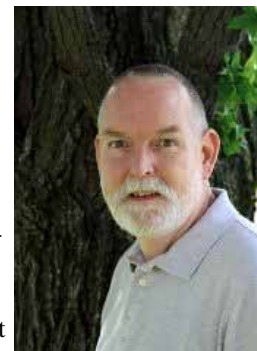




NAPMW Tulsa Green Country Points of Interest

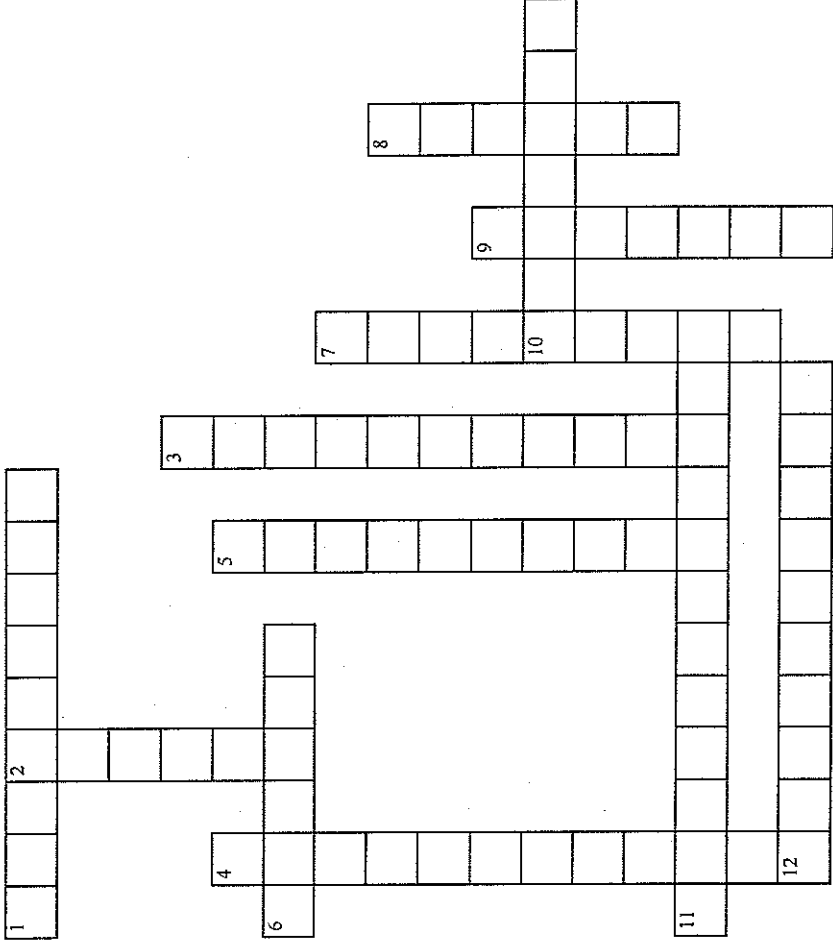
